### **Debut of draft Hawai‘i 2050 Sustainability Plan**

Honolulu – The Hawai‘i 2050 Sustainability Task Force is pleased to announce that the Hawai‘i 2050 Sustainability Summit will be aired live statewide on public access television the morning of Saturday, September 22. The broadcast will unveil the draft Hawai‘i 2050 Sustainability Plan – the first statewide long-term plan for Hawai‘i’s future since the 1970s.

The broadcast is scheduled to begin at 8:55 a.m. and conclude by 12:30 p.m. and will be seen on these stations:

- ‘Olelo, channel 49 (City and County of Honolulu)
- Na Leo O Hawai‘i, channel 52 (Hawai‘i County)
- Ho‘ike channel 53 (Kauai County)
- Akaku, channel 54 (Maui County)

In addition to the draft Hawai‘i 2050 Sustainability Plan, the Summit will feature:

- Keynote speaker Terry Tamminen. He is a former policy advisor to California Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger and is the architect of many of California’s groundbreaking polices and practices.
- Youth and Sustainability: A conversation with the Honolulu Advertiser’s Teen Editorial Board.
- What the Community Is Saying about Sustainability: Community Engagement Report and Hawai‘i 2050 Public Opinion Poll.
